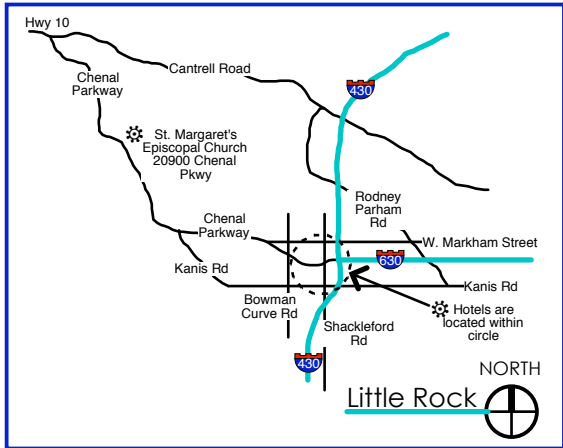

St. Margaret's is located at the east end of Chenal Mountain on Chenal Parkway, which runs from Highway 10 near 300 to Financial Centre Parkway at the I-630 / I-430 interchange.

From I-630: follow Chenal Parkway 6 miles west past Bowman Curve Rd, Markham Street and Kanis Rd. Continue northwest past Technical Drive, Arkansas Systems Drive and Rahling Rd. The church is 1.5 miles past the New Promenade Center on Chenal parkway.

From Highway 10: take Chenal Parkway south at Walmart to the top of the long hill, turn left on Chenal Valley Drive, then turn right onto the church drive.

From I 430: follow Cantrell / Hwy 10 west and turn left at the light at Chenonceau Blvd, turn left on Chenal Parkway going south to the top of the long hill, turn left on Chenal Valley Drive, then turn right onto the church drive.

It speaks the good news without saying a word.



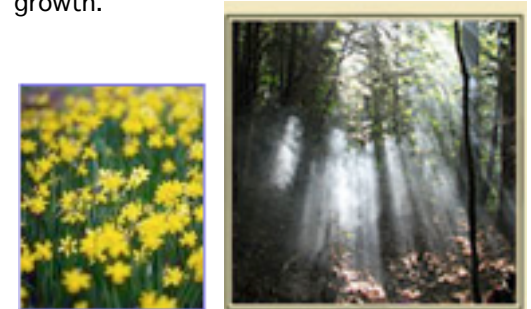
Rev. Susan Sims-Smith, is a Priest Associate at Saint Margaret's Episcopal Church, and Chairman of the Board of Directors for the House of Prayer, both in Little Rock, Arkansas.

After 25 years as a Jungian-oriented psychotherapist, Susan Sims-Smith became an Episcopal priest. She currently directs the SeedWork project, the focus of which is to offer people practical tools for spiritual and personal growth. She teaches people to pray, to meditate, and to work with their nighttime dreams as ways of listening to the movement of the Holy Spirit in their daily lives.



Her work, much of which is rooted in the Sacred Feminine, is connected to the ancient wisdom tradition in Christianity, which is being restored to the modern-day church.

Her couples classes integrate spiritual and psychological learning opportunities, using the relationship itself as the container for growth.
